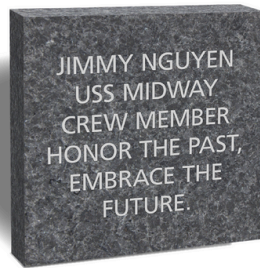
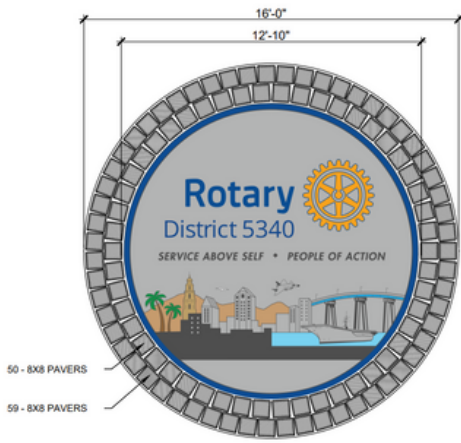

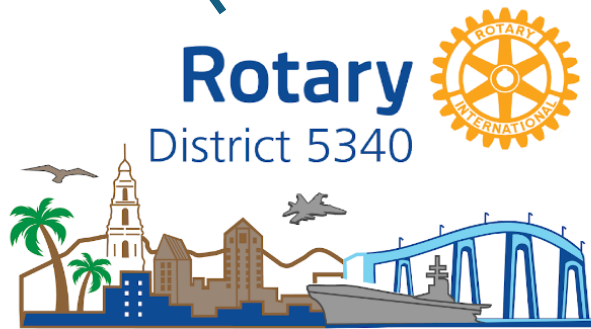
Freedom Park at Navy Pier

The Pier: A Promise Made

For nearly 100 years, Navy Pier has anchored San Diego's waterfront—from its origins as the Naval Supply Corps headquarters, to the final resting place of the USS Midway.

The pier reflects the rich heritage of how hard-working, everyday Americans help preserve our freedoms through service, sacrifice, and support of our military. To drop anchor at Navy Pier, the USS Midway Museum and Port of San Diego made a commitment to someday build a park. Nearly two decades later, the remarkable success of the USS Midway Museum, and new neighboring parking options, has made that promise possible.



Rotary District 5340 has obtained naming rights for a 16-foot diameter roundel at Freedom Park's entrance. The roundel will feature District 5340's logo surrounded by granite stone pavers. Donations to Rotary International District 5340 Charitable Corporation, a 501c3, will cover the naming rights, the roundel's construction, and the pavers. Over 2 million people annually are expected to visit the Museum and Freedom Park, walking over our District logo.
